
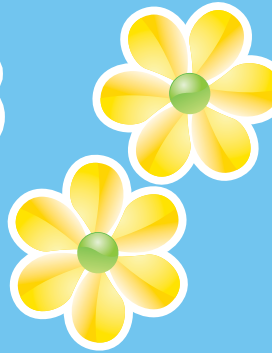


Bright Ideas Conference

Creative ways of implementing the Improving Safety and Reducing Harm - Children, Young People and Domestic Violence toolkit.



- Guidance for schools
- Specific information on sexual abuse and exploitation, so called 'honour' based violence, young people, gangs and teenage pregnancy.
