Course description

This course will build on learning undertaken in the *Domestic Violence - Theory and Practice Level 1* training, by focusing in-depth on the issues of domestic violence risk management and safety planning within the context of drug and alcohol services.

Learning Objectives

- To learn how to assess the risk associated with domestic violence experienced by service users
- To learn how to manage risks and safety plan with victims
- To understand implications for child protection and information sharing protocols within your agency
- To explore ways of improving your agencies' organisational response and to improve multi-agency working.
